

BRIEF ON SOCIETY'S ACTIVITIES

Local engineers founded the Society in 1946 "To enable Engineers and those closely associated with the trade and profession of Engineering to meet and interchange ideas in their respective subjects connected with the various branches of the engineering profession, and to promote the science and practice of Engineering generally amongst its members".

Current membership is 110 including ladies; apprentice members enrolled by their firms can obtain a reduced fee Student membership. The Society has Senior Citizens enrolled on Honorary membership following a 5 years subscribed membership. This encourages a continuation of interest and friendship into retirement.

Lectures take place at Burton Technical College Friday evenings 7.30 to 9.30 p.m. Handouts on subjects are often available and full use is made of audio and visual aids in the excellent lecture theatre. Joint meetings are held annually with the Institute of Mechanical Engineers and we receive a regular invitation to the Institute of Electrical Engineers lecture; attendance is also made to the prestigious 'Faraday' presentation. A programme is arranged for visits to local firms and venturing further afield trips have been made to vehicle testing tracks, airfields, mines and to the viewing of differing manufacturing processes.

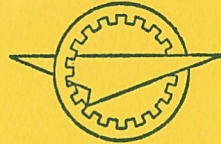
